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## INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES

We have performed the procedures enumerated below, to which the Democratic Executive Committee (the Committee) agreed, solely to assist the Committee in evaluating its compliance with certain requirements included in Ohio Rev. Code Sections 3517.1012, 3517.13(X)(1), 2(b), (3)(a), and (4), 3517.17, and 3517.18, for the year ended December 31, 2009. The Committee is responsible for complying with these requirements. We followed the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants' attestation standards for agreed-upon procedures engagements and applicable attestation engagement standards included in the Comptroller General of the United States' *Government Auditing Standards*. The sufficiency of the procedures is solely the responsibility of the Committee. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

### Cash Receipts

1. We inquired of the Committee whether they deposited all gifts from corporations, labor organizations and all gifts restricted to operations into the same fund into which they deposit amounts received from the State Tax Commissioner. They informed us they received no such gifts.
2. We attempted to foot each *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Deposits* Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.1012 requires (Deposit Form 31-CC), filed for 2010. The Committee did not file the required Form 31-CC, rather they filed the *Statement of Contributions Received* (Form 31-A). Therefore, we footed the *Statement of Contributions Received* (Form 31-A), filed for 2010. We noted no computational errors.

Ohio Rev. Code, Section 3517.10(C)(6)(b), states the Secretary of State shall prescribe the form for all statements required to be filed under this section. As prescribed by the Ohio Secretary of State, the Committee is required to use Deposit Form 31-CC to report all receipts to the Ohio Political Party Fund.

3. We compared bank deposits reflected in 2010 restricted fund bank statements to total deposits recorded in Deposit Forms 31-CC filed for 2010. However, as noted in Step 2 above, the Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Deposits Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.10(C)(6)(b) and 3517.1012 requires (Form 31-CC) was not filed for 2010. Therefore we compared bank deposits reflected in 2010 restricted fund bank statements to total deposits recorded in *Statement of Contributions Received* (Form 31-A), filed for 2010. The bank deposit amounts agreed to the deposits recorded in the Form.
4. We scanned the Committee's 2010 bank statements and noted they reflected four quarterly payments received from the State Tax Commissioner pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code 3517.17(A). The *Statement of Contributions Received* (Form 31-A) reported the sum of these four payments without exception.
5. We scanned other recorded 2010 receipts for evidence that a corporation or labor organization may have exceeded the \$10,000 annual gift limit Ohio Rev. Code 3517.13(X)(3)(a) imposes. We found no evidence that any corporation or labor organization exceeded this limit.

#### **Cash Reconciliation**

1. We recomputed the mathematical accuracy of the December 31, 2010 reconciliation for the bank account used for receipts and disbursements restricted pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.1012(A). We found no computational errors.
2. We agreed the bank balance on the reconciliation to the bank statement balance as of December 31, 2010. The balances agreed.

#### **Cash Disbursements**

1. We requested copies of each *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Disbursements* Ohio Rev. Code, Section 3517.18 and 3517.1012, requires (Disbursement Form 31-M), filed for 2010. The Committee did not file the required Form 31-M, rather they filed the *Statement of Expenditures* (Form 31-B). Therefore we footed the *Statement of Expenditures* (Form 31-B) filed for 2010. We noted no computational errors.

Ohio Rev. Code, Section 3517.17, states the secretary of state shall prescribe the form for all statements required to be filed under this section. As prescribed by the Ohio Secretary of State, the Committee is required to use Disbursement Form 31-M to report all expenditures from the Ohio Political Party Fund.

The Committee used *Statement of Expenditures* (Form 31-B) to report expenditures from the Ohio Political Party. The Committee should use the latest Disbursement Form 31-M to report expenditures from the Ohio Political Party.

2. Per Ohio Rev. Code, 3517.13(X)(1), we scanned Disbursement Form 31-B filed for 2010 and inquired of management whether they transferred any cash from the restricted fund to any other political party account into which contributions may be made or from which contributions or expenditures may be made. We found no evidence of prohibited transfers.
3. We compared the amounts on checks or other disbursements reflected in 2010 restricted fund bank statements to disbursement amounts reported on Disbursement Forms 31-B filed for 2010. We found no discrepancies.

4. For each disbursement on Disbursement Forms 31-B filed for 2010, we traced the payee and amount to payee invoices and to the payee's name on canceled checks. The payees and amounts recorded on Disbursement Forms 31-B agreed to the payees and amounts on the canceled checks and invoices.
5. We scanned the payee for each 2010 disbursement for evidence that it might represent a contribution or campaign-related disbursement, both of which Ohio Rev. Code, 3517.13(X)(2)(b) prohibit. We found no evidence that any restricted fund disbursements represented contributions or campaign-related disbursements.
6. We compared the signature on 2010 checks to the list dated February 7, 2011 of authorized signatories the Committee provided to us. The signatory on all checks we selected was an approved signatory. We compared the endorsement to the payee listed on the check without exception.
7. We scanned each 2010 restricted fund disbursement recorded on Form 31-B for evidence that it represented a transfer from the restricted fund to any other state or county political party, which Ohio Rev. Code, 3517(X)(4) prohibits. We found no evidence of any transfers.
8. We compared the purpose of each disbursement listed on 2010 Disbursement Forms 31-B to the purpose listed on the vendor invoice and to the purposes Ohio Rev. Code, Section 3517.18, permits. We found no instances where the purpose described on the invoice violated the restrictions of Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.18.

We were not engaged to, and did not examine each *Statement of Contributions Received* and *Statement of Expenditures* filed for 2010, the objective of which would have been to opine on compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that we would have reported to you.
