INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES

Marietta-Washington County Convention and Visitors Bureau Washington County

We have performed the procedures enumerated below, which were agreed to by the Board of Trustees and the management of Marietta-Washington County Convention and Visitors Bureau, Washington County, Ohio (the Bureau), on the receipts, disbursements and balances recorded in the Bureaus cash basis accounting records for the years ended December 31, 2017 and 2016 and certain compliance requirements related to those transactions and balances, included in the information provided to us by the management of the Bureau. The Bureau is responsible for the receipts, disbursements and balances recorded in the cash basis accounting records for the years ended December 31, 2017 and 2016 and certain compliance requirements related to these transactions and balances included in the information provided to us by the Bureau. The sufficiency of the procedures is solely the responsibility of the parties specified in this report.

Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

This report only describes exceptions exceeding \$10.

Cash

- 1. We recalculated the December 31, 2017 and December 31, 2016 bank reconciliations. We found no exceptions.
- 2. We agreed the January 1, 2016 beginning fund balances recorded in the Balance Sheet to the December 31, 2015 balances in the prior Agreed-Upon Procedures work papers. We found no exceptions. We also agreed the January 1, 2017 beginning fund balances recorded in the Balance Sheet to the December 31, 2016 balances in the Balance Sheet. We found no exceptions.
- 3. We agreed the totals per the bank reconciliations to the total of the December 31, 2017 and 2016 fund cash balances reported in the Balance Sheet Reports. The amounts agreed.
- 4. We confirmed the December 31, 2017 bank account balance with the Bureau's financial institution. We found no exceptions. We also agreed the confirmed balances to the amounts appearing in the December 31, 2017 bank reconciliation without exception.
- 5. We selected five reconciling debits (such as outstanding checks) haphazardly from the December 31, 2017 bank reconciliation:
 - a. We traced each debit to the subsequent January bank statement. We found no exceptions.
 - b. We traced the amounts and dates to the check register, to determine the debits were dated prior to December 31. There were no exceptions.

Cash Receipts

 We summarized lodging taxes Washington County's Expense Audit Trail reported as payments to the Bureau during the years ending December 31, 2017 and 2016. The total reported disbursements were as follows:

We summarized lodging taxes the City of Marietta's Detail General Ledger reported as payments to the Bureau during the years ending December 31, 2017 and 2016. The total reported disbursements were as follows:

December 31, 2016	\$251,145

2. We compared the amounts from step 1 to amounts recorded as lodging tax receipts from Washington County on the Bureau's Revenue Transaction Detail Report for each year. The Bureau posted the receipts at net, rather than at gross with a memo expense to reflect the 10 percent fee deducted by the County for both 2017 and 2016.

We compared the amounts from step 1 to amounts recorded as lodging tax receipts from the City of Marietta on the Bureau's Revenue Transaction Detail Report for each year. The Bureau did not post the final payment of \$15,839 the City issued on December 19, 2017 until January 1, 2018. The amount posted by the Bureau for 2016 agreed to the amount disbursed by the City.

Cash Disbursements

1. We inquired of management regarding sources describing allowable purposes or restrictions related to the Bureau's disbursements of lodging taxes. We listed these sources and summarized significant related restrictions below:

Source of Restrictions

- a. The Bureau's Articles of Incorporation.
- b. The Bureau's 501(c)(6) Tax Exemption.
- c. Ohio Rev. Code § 5739.09(A)(2).

The Bureau's tax exemption prohibits it from disbursements supporting a candidate's election.

Ohio Rev. Code § 5739.09(A)(2) restricts the Bureau to spending lodging tax "specifically for promotion, advertising, and marketing of the region in which the county is located."

Auditor of State Bulletin 2003-005 deems any disbursement of public funds (e.g. lodging taxes) for alcohol to be improper.

2. We haphazardly selected forty disbursements of lodging taxes from the years ended December 31, 2017 and 2016 in addition to all disbursements exceeding \$5,000, and compared the purpose for these disbursements as documented on vendor invoices or other supporting documentation to the sources of restrictions listed in *Cash Disbursements Step 1* above. We found no instances where the purpose described on the invoice or other supporting documentation described a violation the restrictions listed above.

This agreed-upon procedures engagement was conducted in accordance with the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants' attestation standards and applicable attestation engagement standards included in the Comptroller General of the United States' *Government Auditing Standards*. We were not engaged to, and did not examine or review the Bureau's lodging tax receipts and disbursements for the years ended December 31, 2017 and 2016, the objective of which would have been to opine on lodging tax receipts and disbursements or provide a conclusion. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion or conclusion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that we would have reported to you.

This report is to provide assistance in the evaluation of the Bureau's receipts, disbursements and balances recorded in their cash-basis accounting records for the years ended December 31, 2017 and 2016, and certain compliance requirements related to these transactions and balances and is not suitable for any other purpose.
