

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REPORT OF INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANTS ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES

Democratic Party Executive Committee Hamilton County 615 Main Street Cincinnati, Ohio 45202

We have performed the procedures enumerated below, which were agreed to by the Democratic Party Executive Committee, Hamilton County, Ohio (the Executive Committee), solely to assist the Committee in evaluating its compliance with Sections 3517.17 and 3517.18 of the Ohio Revised Code for the year ended December 31, 2001. Management is responsible for the Committee's compliance with those requirements. We followed the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants' attestation standards for agreed-upon procedures engagements. The sufficiency of the procedures is solely the responsibility of the Executive Committee. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

Cash Receipts

We confirmed the Ohio Political Party Fund receipts with the State of Ohio and agreed them to amounts shown on the Political Party Fund Finance Report. We found no exceptions.

Cash Reconciliation

- 1. We compared the sum of the cash balances recorded on the Committee's Ohio Campaign Finance Report with the cash balances reconciled by the Finance Administrator for the Hamilton County Democratic Party as of December 31, 2001. The sums agreed.
- 2. We recomputed the mathematical accuracy of the reconciliation. We found no computational errors.
- 3. We agreed bank balances on the reconciliation with month end bank statements. The balances agreed.
- 4. We agreed reconciling items appearing on the reconciliation to canceled checks, deposit slips. and other documentation. We determined that the dates on those documents support that those items were proper reconciling items at January 29, 2002.

Cash Disbursements

- 1. We footed the cash disbursement listing and compared the listing totals to the disbursement totals on the political party fund finance report. The amounts agreed.
- 2. We selected all disbursement transactions, and traced the payee and amount to source documentation such as invoices and canceled checks. We also compared the payees on the checks to the names on the invoices. The payees and amounts recorded in the cash disbursement journal agreed to the payees and amounts on the canceled checks.
- 3. We compared the signature on the check to the list dated December 31, 2001 of authorized signatories the Committee provided to us. We compared the endorsement to the payee listed on the check. The signatory on all checks we selected was an approved signatory.

4.. We compared the purpose for the disbursement with the allowable uses described in Section 3517.18 of the Ohio Revised Code.

During our review we were unable to trace some expenditures directly to an invoice and/or the invoice could not be provided. The expenditures appeared reasonable and in compliance with Ohio Revised Code Section 3517.18 based on the vendors being paid. We recommend that applicable invoices be retained in order to maintain proper documentation of all expenditures.

We were not engaged to, and did not, perform an examination, the objective of which would be the expression of an opinion on compliance of the political party fund finance report which is attached to this report. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that we would have reported to you.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Executive Committee and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone else.
